Q36. [Essay] · Cognitive Domain: Analysis

Briefly explain the controversy surrounding familial DNA testing when searching for biological relatives of an unknown evidence profile obtained from crime scene evidence.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Familial DNA testing happens when the suspect's DNA is a partial match, prompting police to question the suspect's immediate and extended family. Doing so can criminalize entire families. This is particularly concerning for families of color because they are disproportionately arrested and incarcerated.

Q37. [Essay] · Cognitive Domain: Analysis

Most scholars see the terms *race* and *ethnicity* as culturally relevant rather than biologically relevant. Compare positive and negative considerations of this position.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Viewing race and ethnicity as culturally relevant considers the changing nature of human identity. Doing so provides an understanding of how historical, social, and cultural factors shape people's experiences. However, this position can overlook the impact of systemic racism and discrimination, downplaying the effect of structural inequalities. Focusing only on culture also reinforces stereotypes.

There were nearly 12 million more people of Hispanic/Latino descent in the United States in 2020 than there were in 2010. This trend has resulted in concerns not only about immigration in general but also illegal immigration. Are these concerns justified? Explain your answer.

Suggested answer: Sample response: The concerns about the increasing Hispanic/Latino population is complicated. Some people claim that this growth contributes to cultural diversity. However, others are worried about issues it brings concerning resources, especially in regard to job availability.

The terms *organized crime* and *mafia* became synonymous with Italians following their immigration to the United States. A congressional report described Italian immigrants as morally deficient, excitable, and vengeful. Is this an example of implicit bias? Explain your answer.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Yes, this is an example of implicit bias. It stereotypes an ethnic group based on negative characteristics, perpetuating stereotypes and reinforcing prejudices. It also overlooks the vast majority of Italians that are law-abiding citizens who contribute to society.

Explain the concept of reverse discrimination and provide an example.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Reverse discrimination happens when someone from a majority group experiences discrimination. For example, a man sues his employer because a female colleague received favorable treatment for being a woman, while he received unfavorable treatment for being a man.
