Chapter 2: Diversity Theories

Answer: C. Answer is found in the section immediately after the Opening Case. Stereotyping is a generalization about a group or its members.

2. The statement “I don’t like my neighbor because he is middle aged and White” reflects...

- A. prejudice
- B. discrimination
- C. stereotyping
- D. modern racism

Answer: A. Answer is found in the section immediately after the Opening Case. The speaker is **taking a generalization/stereotype** about middle-aged White males and **applying** it to a specific person, his/her neighbor, **on the basis of** the neighbor’s **group affiliation**. This is a racist attitude.

3. Determine the appropriate category for the following statement: “This candidate qualified for the accounting position, but she is biracial. I don’t want biracial people in my company because they can’t be trusted.”

- A. prejudice
- B. discrimination
- C. stereotyping
- D. a personal opinion

Answer: B. Answer is found in the section immediately after the Opening Case. The speaker’s statement describes an **action or undesirable treatment** toward an individual because of her group affiliation. This is **more than** prejudice. **The action** of rejecting the applicant for a position for which she qualifies constitutes discrimination.

4. Determine which of the following diversity theories best explains the treatment directed at the young biracial teenage girl described in the opening case.

- A. realistic group conflict theory
- B. similarity-attraction theory
- C. social identity theory
- D. social categorization theory

Answer: D (the young girl is being categorized by her demographics). Answer is found in the section “Social Categorization Theory.”

5. The following are components of Social Categorization Theory **except**...
- A. Social categorization is a natural process that serves a functional purpose for people.
 - B. Social categorization explains why people react as they do in the face of scarcity.
 - C. Social categorization is a source of the individual’s self-concept and self esteem.

Answer: B. Answer is found in the section “Social Categorization Theory.”

6. According to Realistic Group Conflict Theory, a solution to intergroup conflict may be to...

Answer: C. Answer is found in the section “Social Categorization Theory.”

Answer: A. Answer is found in the section “Social Categorization Theory.”

Answer: D because Social Identity Theory does not seek to explain the outcomes of scarce resources.

9. The case of the British-Iranian woman in the Global View who was put in jail for attending a men’s sporting event exemplifies...

- C. the relational demography theory
- D. the critical race theory

Answer: A. Answer is found in the section “Social Categorization Theory.” The clash between the protesters and the Iranian government was the result of the lack of power on the part of the former. The protesters were, in essence, exerting power, albeit limited, to oppose full gender segregation.

10. All of the following could be outcomes of similarity-attraction and relational demography effects except for...

- A. in-groups and out-groups are formed
- B. uncertainty is reduced for team members
- C. the team will be more creative
- D. team members will be more cohesive

Answer: C. Answer is found in the section “Similarity Attraction and Relational Demography.” If teams become more homogenous due to similarity effects, they will tend to be less creative.

Answer: B. Answer is found in the sections “Modern Racism and Modern Sexism” and “Critical Race Theory.”

14. The status construction theory would explain that...

- A. because resources are limited, the Burmese majority is afraid that Myanmar’s ethnic groups will demand more resources and, therefore, they were not invited to welcome the East Asia Summit dignitaries.
